Dog Fouling

We have recently noticed an increase in dog mess being left around the village and especially down the footpath leading to the fields down Chapel Lane.

Not only is it unpleasant for everyone walking through the village, but it also poses a health risk - especially to children!

We kindly remind all dog owners to carry bags and clean up after their pets. There are bins near both bus stops in the village and we are currently looking at providing another bin down Station Road.

It has been raised by some residents about having dog waste bins around the village, in the hope that this would encourage people to use them.

Many years ago, the village did have such bins but they were not always emptied regularly and the Council decided that we should use the main litter bins for this matter.

Unfortunately, this issue is in every town, village and city and ultimately it is down to the owner to pick up after their pet. With the increase of families with small children now in the village, I hope that we could all be thoughtful of others and do our part to keep our village welcoming for everyone.



Residents have raised concerns about vehicles travelling too fast through our village, especially down Livesey Road.
With more young families recently moved here, road safety has become a greater priority.

The Parish council is currently exploring possible measures to help reduce speeding.

We know that most drivers do take care but the village is often used as a cut through and the speed restrictions are being ignored.
